

NEXT STEPS

THE PLANNING PROCESS

This public event forms part of Breedon's pre-application consultation with the local community.

Once the pre-application consultation is complete, Breedon intend to make a planning application to the Planning Authority. It is currently anticipated that the application will be submitted within 2 to 3 months following the first public event.

Once the planning application is received by the Planning Authority, it will undergo a thorough consultation process where organisations such as NatureScot and SEPA will be offered the opportunity to comment on our proposals.


The Planning Authority will also accept comments on the planning application from members of the public and interested parties.

Following the closure of the Planning Authority's statutory consultation period, and once the Planning Authority is satisfied that it has sufficient information to determine the planning application, the Planning Authority will assess the application against planning policy contained within the Development Plan. That assessment will be set out within an Officer Report.

The Planning Authority will consider all comments received by formal consultees and members of the public before making a recommendation or taking a final decision on the application.

It is likely the planning application will be referred to a Planning Committee, consisting of locally elected Councillors, for final determination.
